RUNNING THE RACE... OR RIDING THE RACE

Some of us can't run... but we can ride a bike ...to Lexington.

One of our own Zone presidents (Land of Lakes), Carla Elenz, has committed to riding a bike to Lexington from her home in Gaylord to raise funds for mites. The ride is called "Miles for Mites" and she is asking you to contribute to mites in honor of her ride. She will be leaving Gaylord on June 11 and arrive in Lexington on June 23, in time for the convention. The total distance is about 550 miles and she will be riding about 50 miles a day. Along the way she will be staying with LWML host families and is



looking forward to meeting other LWML sisters.

Carla is asking you, first, to be prayer warriors and lift her up each day while she is on the road.
