How exciting and blessed it is to come together to celebrate the 80th anniversary of LWML Michigan District at the 39th Biennial Michigan District Convention in Frankenmuth. After over two years of a pandemic, God has blessed us as we rejoice together under the Convention theme, "My Sheep Hear My Voice; I know them and they follow Me" (John 10:27). What could be more fitting then to begin this convention with hundreds of God's people Listening to His Voice in word and song at the 6:30 pm Opening Worship Service on Thursday July 7th at St. Lorenz Lutheran Church.

The Proclaimer for the service is **Rev. Christian Jones** who serves as a Michigan District LCMS
Missionary at Large. For the past three years he has
served the Franklin Avenue Mission; The
York Avenue Mission; Mercy House and the Luke
Clinic of Flint as the executive director of Flint Mission

difficulties in Flint and surrounding areas.

The Worship Service Choir Director, **Jon Eifert** serves as Music Director of St Michaels Lutheran Church and School in Richville, Michigan. We thank him for taking the time for us from his full-time parish music responsibilities to lead our voices in praising God.

Worship Service Organist, **Nathan Beethe** serves as Kantor at Grace Lutheran Church in Auburn, overseeing all parish music, Sunday School, and teaching Bible Class. For several years he has also coordinated an area-wide hymn festival. We are blessed to have him keep us in tune as we praise God.

Attendees are truly blessed as we hear God's "Voice", sing His praises, listen to the beautiful voices of the choir; and receive the Body and Blood of Christ for forgiveness of sins. Every Mitey Mite Counts into the Big LWML Picture!

Delegates at this 39th Biennial LWML Michigan District convention have been doing their "homework" about the 14 mission grant proposals that will be decided for funding during this 2022-2024 biennium. The grant proposals represent \$289,500.00 of requested funding. The Board of Directors has agreed to recommend funding grants in the amount of \$260,000.00.

Mission grants are funded through the mites goal. For 2022-2024, the LWML Michigan mites goal has been budgeted as \$346,700.00. When delegates vote for their choices of which of the 14 proposals to fund, they will designate on their ballot their eight most favored grant proposals. When votes are tabulated, the proposals which have gained the greatest number of votes are set to be funded up to the recommended \$260,000.00.



The mite goal must account for the fact that 25 per cent of mite receipts must be appropriated to national LWML's mite goal. Thus, to fulfill LWML Michigan's mission grants goal, a 25 per cent greater amount needs to be received, in order to award to the national organization LWML Michigan's fair share.

When delegates have prayed for wisdom in their act of voting, after having read the complete resolutions of each grant proposal, and done other reading about the requestors, they may feel confident that their ballots were wisely marked. Thank you, delegates, for assuming the responsibility of voting and for being ready to save those mitey mites to fund through LWML Christ-honoring mission work!
