Financial Assistance for Concordia Theological Seminary
Ft. Wayne, Indiana, Food & Clothing Co-Op to Purchase Food - \$10,000

Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His Harvest fields".

Matthew 9:37-38.

Concordia Theological Seminary is preparing workers to serve in the harvest fields. These men and women are carrying the compassion of Christ to His people. In serving these students during their years of study by helping to relieve the financial burden of feeding and clothing their families, Concordia is furthering the mission and ministry of the Word as they prepare to carry His word to the lost.

Individuals from this country and the world come to Concordia Theological Seminary to prepare to serve God's people here in the United States as well as in mission work around the world. When these students make the decision to enter the seminary, most with families, they no longer have the same financial flow of funds as they did before. The Food Co-op, on campus, plays a key role in helping students feed their families during their seminary years. The seminary seeks to reduce this financial burden by providing students' access to a Food Co-op that supplies 80% to 85% of all families' food and household needs each month at no cost to the student. The Co-op is supported through the donations of individual donors, churches, and other organizations.

This Grant for \$10,000 will be used to purchase only perishable food items each month; milk, eggs, cheese, fruit juice,

ground beef, fresh fruits and vegetables.
