MISSION GRANT HIGHLIGHT

God's Word for Teenagers Around the World Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF) = \$16,500

The Holy Spirit, at Pentecost, gave Jesus' disciples the gift of speaking in many tongues so that all God's children might hear His Word in their own languages. Acts 2:1-11.

Included in God's family are teenagers, who because they are not children, and not yet adults, often slip between the cracks when providing resources to share the Gospel. Missionaries and churches in countries like Indonesia, Thailand and Cambodia have asked the Lutheran Heritage Foundation for a Bible storybook that is especially well suited to teaching the Lutheran faith to teens.

Lutheran books in these languages are also needed for sharing the Good News with immigrant families here in Michigan, giving LCMS congregations the resources, they need to establish relationships with immigrants in their communities.

The Lutheran Heritage Foundation, a Michigan based LCMS recognized service organization, has created a new resource, God's Word For You, a Bible storybook

specially written at the teen level. It costs only

\$5.00 to print each
Bible storybook which
means these books can
be produced for the
requested Grant of
\$16,500. This funding
would go toward
translating and printing
2,500 storybooks



written in a language they can read and understand.
