# GREATER DETROIT ZONE SPEAKER IS FIRST ROSA J. YOUNG SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

The LWML Greater Detroit Zone Fall Rally was held at St. Philip, Detroit, under the theme - "Continuing the Legacy of Dr. Rosa J. Young." The speaker was Mackenzie Jean-Marcoux, the first recipient of the Dr. Rosa J Young Opportunity Scholarship at Concordia University Chicago. This award provides support for African American students pursuing church-related professions at CUC. The Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) and the LCMS Foundation worked together to establish the Dr. Rosa J Young Scholarship Endowment at both Concordia University Chicago, Concordia University Wisconsin and Concordia University Ann Arbor as part of the continuing legacy of Dr. Rosa J Young, who worked tirelessly to educate African American children and young adults and regularly told them that their future was working for the church.
